CALL TO ORDER - *The virtual meeting was called to order at 7:00PM by Mayor Melanie Hammet. Present were Mayor Pro Tem Jean Bordeaux and Council Members Augusta Woods, Brandy Hall and Tracey Brantley and Brandy Beavers. Also, in attendance were Chief Sarai Y'Hudah-Green; City Administrator Valerie Caldwell and City Attorney Susan Moore. Administrative Assistant Missye Varner was not present.*

NEW BUSINESS

Catrina Davis appeal request for Fence Permit at 498 Spring Drive - *Moore led the discussion and guided council through the appeals process and reference Ordinance Section 7-9(f) of the fence section. The application was denied by Zoning Administrator Caldwell after review. Ms. Davis asked why the wire fencing was not allowed and that several homes had similar fencing in place. Ms. Davis believes the ordinance material requirements and description sounded more like farming fencing. Davis said that she sent a photo of the proposed fence and asked council to reconsider her proposed fence for the front half of her yard. Caldwell stated that upon review of the application and the standards within the ordinance, the decorative wire material was not acceptable. Upon discussion of Council the appeal was denied.*

Adoption of Resolution 05-2020 for Budget Amendment – *This item was deleted by Caldwell from the agenda.*

OLD BUSINESS

COVID-19 Update- *Brantley presented graphs that showed the increase in COVID-19 within zip codes in DeKalb and Gwinnett and stated there has been a significant increase within the last two weeks. Hammet stated that Dr. Kathleen Toomey, Georgia Commissioner of the Dept. of Public Health was assigned armed guard because health officials are being targeted. Georgia is increasing in cases and not in uniformed cases throughout the state. The age bracket of the 20-30-year-old population is the current demographic experiencing surges. Hammet stated there are 160 testing sites and 1,300 contact tracers. The state needs everyone's cooperation in testing and prevention measures. Hammet was informed that 20% of the state has tested positive.*
