Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 7:00PM by Mayor Melanie Hammet. Present – Mayor Melanie Hammet, Mayor pro tem Jean Bordeaux, Council members Tracey Brantley, Brandy Hall and Augusta Woods. Also, present were Acting City Administrator Peggy Merriss and Administrative Coordinator Missye Varner. Council member Brandy Beavers, Police Chief Sarai Y'Hudah-Green and City Attorney Susan Moore were not in attendance.

Announcements/Communication

Mayor Pro tem Bordeaux communicated that she and Council member Woods met with resident Kim Fugate regarding the ROKS Bar-Be-Que Cookout at the new Poplar Park which is adjacent to her house. Ms. Woods stated that Ms. Fugate is fine with it. Ms. Bordeaux recommended demarcating her property from Poplar Park and suggested installing plantings to separate the two properties. The event is scheduled for Saturday, November 6^{th} from 11:00 am -2:00 pm.

Council member Woods announced that the Makers Mart Event will be at various resident homes on Sunday, November 7th from 11:00am – 4:00pm and a Food Truck will be at the Club House.

Mayor Hammet communicated that she has spoken with several residents, and they said that the 2021 Beach Policy was brilliant and that the abbreviated version of the beach season was enjoyable. Mayor Hammet thanked Council and Acting City Administrator Merriss for their diligent work on the policy.

Mayor Hammet thanked resident Jennifer Galen, Lt. Robert Palms and Officer Jason Cooper and the entire Pine Lake community for assisting in the location of a missing child. She also thanked Chief Green for posting the information on the public safety section of the website.

Adoption of Agenda

Mayor Hammet amended the agenda by adding to New Business the purchase of a Kubota 48" Zero Turn Mower to replace a 2006 John Deere Zero mower.

On a motion by Council member Woods, seconded Council member Hall, and all council members present voting "aye," the amended agenda was adopted.

The adoption of the budget to Implement the Food Well Grant Program was deferred pending additional information for the carpentry scope of work and inclusion of bird habitat as it relates to the project that could be supported by the McAllister Fund. There may be some adjustments to the project as it relates to the carpentry. Also, the role of volunteers was discussed and will need to be clarified along with scheduling.

Ms. Kinsley also said that she has a chipper shredder vacuum and that as a community effort she and her neighbors would be utilizing it to help Public Works get leaves out of the street this fall season.






